
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Past president's farewell letter:



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PREVIOUS MEETING

GRS Congress 2024 (Stockholm, Sweden, May 2024)

A collaboration between GRS and the European Society of Endocrinology. The two-day meeting provided an update on basic, translational and clinical research in the field of growth hormone related diseases. Among other topics, diagnosis and new treatment options for growth hormone deficiency were discussed. The format includes plenaries from leading experts in the field, and oral and poster sessions.

A Session on Diagnosis of GHD using the Delphi process was chaired by Jens Otto Jørgensen (DK) with discussion on the controversies about diagnosis of GHD in children and in adults presented by Adda Grimberg (USA) and Christian Strasburger (Germany), and new diagnostic tests were presented by Kevin CJ Yuen (USA). A symposium on Long-acting GH was chaired by Gudmundur Johannsson (Sweden), with the experience in children presented by Xiaoping Luo (China), in adults by Beverly MK Biller (USA) and monitoring LAGH treatment with IGF-I by Katharina Schilbach (Germany). The session GH from bench to bedside and registries with the topic "Growth Hormone, Mini-Mice, Football, Dirty Shorts, and a New Drug" was presented by John Kopchick (USA) and the "Endocrine Therapies Registry

Project" by Faisal Ahmed (UK). The Pituitary Society lecture GH and cancer was presented by Shlomo Melmed (USA). During the GRS congress the GRS General Assembly meeting was conducted.

GroPro Meeting 2024 (Stirling, Scotland, August 2024) Growth hormone and prolactin, basic and translational science

Announcing the formation of a new special interest group, supported by the Pituitary Society. The group's origins are from the long-standing "Gordon Conference" on Prolactin, and the subsequent "FASEB SRC" on the GH/PRL Family in Health and Disease. The group has decided to move to an independent conference format, under the auspices of the Pituitary Society. The goal is to hold scientific meetings every two years, focused on the fundamental biology of these two pituitary hormones and their complex range of targets. The meetings had an "all inclusive" residential format similar to previous meetings, but at a significantly reduced cost, with significant assistance to students and early career researchers and speakers coming from developing economies. It was chaired by Paul Le Tissier (Edinburgh, UK) and Sebastian Neggers (Erasmus, NL). GRS is supporting this meeting at the Bronze Sponsorship Level (2500 pounds).

UPCOMING MEETINGS

Joint Congress of ESPE and ESE 2025 (Copenhagen, Denmark, 10-13 May 2025)

The joint Congress between the European Society for Paediatric Endocrinology (ESPE) and the European Endocrinology (ESE), 'Connecting of Society Endocrinology Across the Life Course', will bring together paediatric and adult endocrine specialists from across Europe and the rest of the world to meet, collaborate and celebrate endocrinology in Copenhagen, Denmark. GRS is currently working on a symposium on Growth Hormone during the Joint Congress.

GRS Workshop 2025, date and location to be defined. A workshop on "GH treatments" focus on Long-Acting GH and GH secretagogues, with an update of the new formulations, recent findings and recommendations.

19th International Pituitary Congress (San Francisco, California, July 9 - 11, 2025)



Membership Forum (Boston, 2nd June 2024)

The Pituitary Society held its Biennial Membership Forum in Boston on Sunday June 2nd 2024 preceded by a CME meeting: Advancing Acromegaly Awareness & Clinical Decision- Making in a New Treatment Era. This was a 1-hour multi-accredited live satellite symposium with a downloadable point-of-care shared decision-making resource and was well attended with over 100 registrants. Relevant portions from the recorded symposium livestream will be condensed into two stand-alone videos with distinct themes. The videos will be available on the Society's website soon. The meeting was followed by the Society dinner attended by the founders of the Pituitary Society: Seymour Reichlin, Richard Robbins, and Shlomo Melmed who all gave wonderful stories about its formation including agreeing the date of incorporation: 1994. Shlomo Melmed was awarded the Outstanding Pituitary Society Leadership Award and gave a memorable history of the Societies' journal The Pituitary first published in 1997 and

and now, under Andrea Giustina as Editor-in-Chief, is going from strength to strength with over 300 submissions a year and a 5-year impact factor of 4.1.

Pituitary Society Committees
